Regular Meeting

The Regular Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Pittstown was held June 10, 2024 at the Town Hall, Tomhannock, New York. Those present included, Supervisor, Matthew Curley, Councilperson, Robert Russell, Tanya Lipinski, Erin Maxon and Jason Eddy. Paul Campbell, Highway Superintendent and Stacey Goldstein, Town Attorney were also present. Supv. Curley called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

PUBLIC HEARING ON EXTENDING MORATORIUM ON MOBILE HOME PARK APPLICATIONS

Motion: Curley, Second: Eddy to open the public hearing at 6:30 p.m. on extending the moratorium on mobile home park applications. Vote: Ayes – all; Nays – none. Supv. Curley asked for comments; there were none.

PUBLIC ACCESS

No one wished to speak.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES (5/13/24)

Motion: Eddy, Second: Russell to accept the May 13th minutes as presented. Vote: Ayes – Russell, Maxon, Eddy & Curley. Nays – none; Abstains – Lipinski.

REPORTS OF OFFICERS AND CONSULTANTS

Motion: Maxon, Second: Eddy to accept the Town Clerk’s report as presented. Vote: Ayes – all; Nays – none. Reports were received from the Highway Superintendent and Dog Control. Note: the bookkeeper’s laptop would not turn on so no reports were able to be printed.

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES AND THEIR REPRESENTATIVES

ERCSWMA – Russell reported that they are meeting on June 26th. We have a new hauler for the electronics. They have already been used in Schaghticoke; it went well.

Highway – Campbell attended the annual highway school last week. He stated that he was thankful that he and the Town Board get along so well; others are not so fortunate. The classes were informative

Buildings – Curley stated that he has contacted our roofer to see if he can replace the piece of molding that is missing off the steeple. He is waiting on a call back.

OLD BUSINESS

Tomhannock Fire Protection – Goldstein stated that the resolutions have been submitted to the State Comptroller; we haven’t heard anything in response.

NEW BUSINESS

2024 Highway Agreement – Motion: Maxon, Second: Eddy to accept the 2024 Highway Agreement as presented. Vote: Ayes – all; Nays – none.

MEMBERS PRIVILEGE

Russell – nothing; Lipinski – nothing; Maxon – nothing; Eddy – nothing; Curley – we have heard nothing in regards to the bell restoration. He thanked M. Hoag for her help with the hazardous mitigation plan. The reval is complete – grievance day was May 28th. He and the Board received a letter from the Village asking if the Towns of Schaghticoke & Pittstown were interested in applying for a grant for zoning/planning. We just redid our Land Use Regulations; we are not interested. S. Goldstein stated that she is not ready to proceed with the solar moratorium.

PUBLIC ACCESS

Stacey Goldstein stated that the Ford Road bridge came out beautiful.

Motion: Curley, Second: Eddy to close the public hearing on extending the moratorium on mobile home park applications at 6:45 p.m. Vote: Ayes – all; Nays – none. Motion: Curley; Second: Maxon to extend the moratorium on mobile home park applications for a period of six (6) months. Vote: Ayes – all; Nays – none.
